

QUARTERLY REPORT - July - September 2021

Greetings from Montfort Community Development Society (MCDS), Chennai.

We are happy to share this report of our activities for the quarter-ending September 2021.

Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR):

After the break of two months due pandemic, all our four CBR centres reopened on 1st July 2021, for the academic year 2021-22. Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy, Vocational Skills Training, and Monthly Parents Meetings were held on a regular basis during this

We have continued to provide pre-employment training in hospitality, house-keeping, and shop management to our Special Youth with the hope of finding them a job in the future.

Independence Day was celebrated in all of our centres observing COVID 19 protocols. Our Special Children and Youth actively participated in the function, held in full view of the general public. The Greater Chennai Corporation's Health Officer, Friends of MCDS, and local participants were among the Guests.

Study Centres:

All our Ten Study Centres in the relocated slum areas with a permitted maximum strength of thirty have resumed for the academic year on 1st July 2021-22. Children were visibly happy to be back at their centres to learn and to meet their friends after the lockdowns were lifted.

Apart from academics, children are actively involved in indoor games, art, crafts, drawing and paintings and other creative initiatives from Waste to unique products. They enjoy their weekly outing with their staffs. In the new arrangement of a supervisor for every three centres, the Study Centres are functioning very effectively with near full strength.

Health Programme:

During the reporting period, the Clinic on Wheels, with a doctor and a trained nurse, as well as support staff, equipped with sufficient stock of free medicines, reached out to over 7,000 (Seven Thousand) people.

Eye Screening Camps & Spectacles Distribution:

As in the past, MCDS in collaboration with "India Vision Institute" (IVI)organized Eye Screening programme for the Special Children, Youth, SHG Women and General Public at Srinivasapuram, Chemmencherry, Pulianthope, Triplicane, Kannagi Nagar, Kandigai, Old Perumbakkam and Valluvar Nagar. One Thousand people benefitted during this quarter ending September 2021.

Three Hundred and Seventy Five Spectacles were distributed in August and September to those with defective vision where we had the screenings by 'India Vision Institute' between July to September 2021.

Health and Hygiene Awareness:

Awareness programs on Hypertension, Diabetes and TB were organized for the General public during this reporting period and Three Hundred and Seventy Six underprivileged people in the slums and relocated slum areas of Chennai were benefitted. This programme was organized in association with "Resource group for Education and Advocacy for Community Health" (REACH).

Women Empowerment Programme:

Regular monitoring of accounts for the SHG groups and monthly meeting were held in all the Federations, namely Adyar, Thiruvanmiyur South Mada, Valluvar Nagar, Kannagi Nagar and Chemmencherry.

Forty Eight SHG Members from the Valluvar Nagar participated in Alcoholism awareness program. Mr. Sabapathy from TTK hospital enlightened the beneficiaries about withdrawal symptoms, health issues caused due to liquor consumption and the management & treatment.

A small but welcome deviation for the present batch is that the 'BEST FIVE' out of the twenty will be awarded a Tailoring machine each at the end of their training course.

Dry Ration Relief and Food Distribution:

Due to partial lockdown and layoffs, many people in relocated slum areas were not able to get back to their work. MCDS reached out to these underprivileged people by distributing sumptuous food in our working areas with the support of Brothers from Perungudi Community and Rev. Fr. James of St. Pius X Church, Perungudi. More than Three Hundred cooked Food packets were distributed to the disadvantaged people on a daily basis.
